The Douglas County Museum has been collecting, preserving and exhibiting natural and cultural history items for nearly forty years.

Home to Oregon's largest natural history collection on display, the Museum's more than 7,500 items are used to help tell the ancient and contemporary stories of the Umpqua River Valley. In addition, DCM houses one of the Northwest's most comprehensive plant collections in its research Herbarium with nearly 3,000 catalogued specimens.

The historical artifact collection is one of the most extensive in the state with over 8,640 items that illustrate area history. The Museum holds Oregon's second largest historic photograph collection with more than 24,000 images going back as early as the mid 19th century.

Built in 1933, the Rochester Covered Bridge features windows with graceful curved tops. Directions: Two miles west of I-5 on Highway 138 turn north on Stearns Lane to Rochester Road. The bridge is just north of the intersection of Stearns Lane and Rochester Road.

National Scenic Byway, Highway 138-Travel east from I-5 to experience one of the best roads in the nation for scenic beauty and recreational opportunities.

Colliding Rivers

Just 18 minutes east of Roseburg stop at the viewpoint of Colliding Rivers and see where the swift, deep waters of the North Umpqua River meet the rapids of sparkling Little River head-on.

HISTORIC CITIES-Historic Roseburg (Full Day Tour)

Experience the history of **Roseburg Town Center** which offers an assortment of shops, art galleries, antique stores and restaurants.

Just 12 miles north of Roseburg on I-5. Established in 1881 around a grist mill, is **Oakland**. Explore historic brick buildings, a museum, antique shops, and a restaurant with old-fashioned ice cream parlor and fine dining

Heading north on I-5 exit #142 will tour you through the rolling landscape of lush green pastures and onto **MarshAnne Landing** for some wine tasting and art viewing. <http://marshannelanding.com/>

Scenic Drive on Highway 138-Travel west from Sutherlin on Highway 138, a designated state scenic byway. Take a break in Elkton and visit Brandborg, Bradley and River's Edge wineries.

Stick around Elkton and see the Butterfly Pavilion. Walk through butterfly and hummingbird gardens and circle through the 4.5-acre botanical garden featuring native shrubs and trees planted to represent the climate zones of Oregon.

Follow the main Umpqua River to the Pacific Ocean. Just before Reedsport, stop at the Dean Creek Elk Viewing area. Here you will have an opportunity to see a herd of wild elk. Enjoy the Coast, stop at the Discovery Center in Reedsport to learn more about the local and natural history. Visit the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area and check out the Umpqua River Lighthouse. Enjoy fresh seafood at one of the many restaurants in the Salmon Harbor area in Winchester Bay. Travel South on Highway 101-check out the rocky headlands of Cape Arago and the beautiful formal gardens at Shore Acres near Coos Bay. Return to Roseburg via Highway 42.
